Education Week

Values wristbands

Traffic arrangements

It has come to my attention that some parents are still driving too fast around the school block and parking in inappropriate spaces. The disable park at the front of the school is for those displaying a disable sticker only. The school carpark is for staff and visitors only. Parents must not park here at morning and afternoon drop-off as students and families are exiting school at this time. The school gates will be closed from 8.45-9.15am and 3.15-3.45pm to ensure the safety of students.

I am very excited to announce that Kingsbury Primary School has been successful in gaining access to Bike Education. Earlier this year I submitted an application to Darebin Council for the provision of a fleet of bicycles, which will belong to the school. I received advice this week that we were a successful applicant, and, so in Term 3 or 4 we will begin lessons for students in Years 3-6. I look forward to seeing our students take part in this exciting initiative. I will provide more information as soon as it becomes available.

Head lice are Back!

Unfortunately, head lice are back! The easiest and most effective way to find head lice is to use the conditioner and comb treatment.

- ▶ Step 1 Comb hair conditioner onto dry, brushed (detangled) hair.
- ▶ Step 2 Thorough comb sections of the hair with a fine tooth head lice comb.
- ▶ Step 3 Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel.
- ▶ Step 4 Look on the paper towel and on the comb for lice and eggs.
- ▶ Step 5 Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least four or five times.
- ▶ Step 6 ***If lice or eggs are found, the student should be treated before returning to school.***

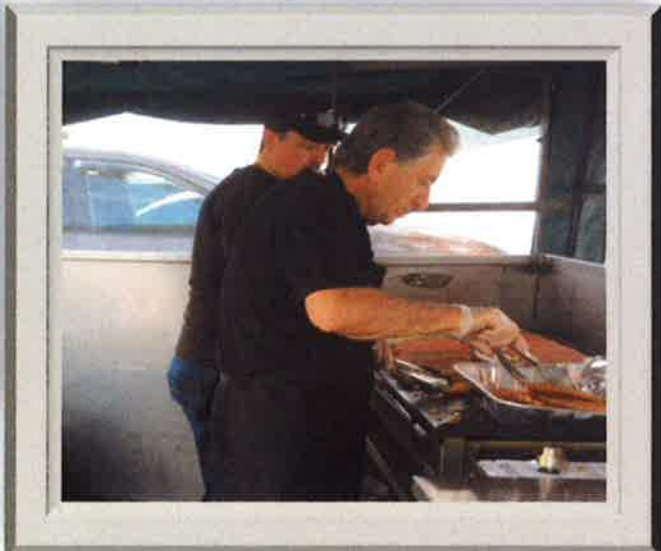
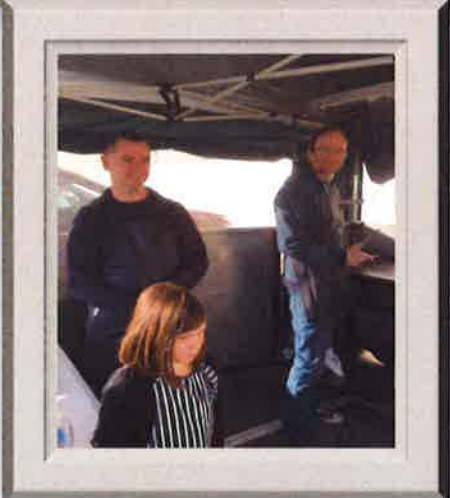
