#### ***Illness & Children coming to school***

We will hold a grand parade on the morning of the 18th and award a prize to each grade level for creative book character costumes. We will be asking for a gold coin donation on this day with all funds raised going towards new books for our library.

### Darebin Libraries

Attached to this week's newsletter is a membership form for Darebin Libraries. On a recent visit to Reservoir Library, I met with their librarian Rose and learnt about some great resources they would like to share with all our students and families. By joining Darebin libraries you can access all on-site resources, including free internet access in 1 hour blocks. You can also access their on-line resources from home. They have set up a child friendly app called Planet Library which will give your child access to programs like First Readers, Literacy Planet, World Book Web (ideal for projects), Your Tutor for numeracy and literacy support plus more for free. The closest Darebin Libraries to Kingsbury are Reservoir and Preston. Students can complete membership forms and drop them at the school for submission to Darebin Libraries. This must be done no later than Monday 28th August, 2017.

### CBCA 2017 Shortlisted Books

A selection of the CBCA Awarded books have arrived in our library.

*'Mechanica'* An imaginative field guide to the fantasy world of Mechanica creatures, with amazing and beautiful steampunk-inspired illustrations. In this field guide from the future, a dashing explorer-Miss Liberty Crisp-details amazing creatures known as Mechanica: human-created life forms designed to replace extinct species.

*'Rockhopping'* A novel illustrated in a graphic style, and the story of an eventful hike in Gariwerd (the Grampians). A boy named Clancy and his Uncle Egg go on a rambling, rockhopping adventure to find the source of the Glenelg River. What could go wrong?

*'Go Home, Cheeky Animals'* At Canteen Creek where we live, there are cheeky dogs everywhere. But when the cheeky goats, donkeys, buffaloes and camels make mischief in the camp, the dogs just lie there - until those pesky animals really go too far. Then the cheeky camp dogs roar into action! The illustrator of this book, Dion Beasley is a young indigenous man who was born in Alice Springs, is profoundly deaf and diagnosed with Muscular Dystrophy. His inspiration was the camp dogs he sees when he visits his grandfather at Mulga Camp on the edge of Tennant Creek.

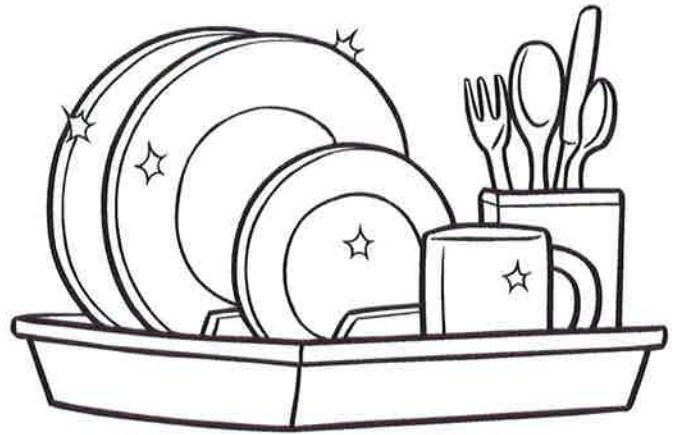
